

Father Alasdair Writes...

Welcome to The Anglican Parish of Box Hill this Trinity Sunday.

Theology is often referred to as "Faith seeking understanding". When it comes to expressing our faith in words, the path can get quite sticky, and that's where we find ourselves today. The festival of the Trinity is the only time of our church year when we take a look at the way we voice our understanding of one of the deepest mysteries about our God. The basic statements we use are the Creeds: Apostles', Nicene, and Latin. There are indeed others, but these three are the ones that have made it into our Prayer Book.

They all speak of God as the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Each of these so-called "persons" (a strongly theologically laden word) is identified separately and quite well, but what is not so well done and is therefore much harder to grasp, is how these three "persons" are united and indeed unified in the "godhead". This is deep mystery, and in essence, unknowable from our standpoint in the material world. Coming to terms with it relies more on dealing with paradox, than of strict analysis. My prayer is that we can all open our hearts to acceptance of this mystery, if only in an incomplete way, rather than close our minds due to struggling with inadequate explanations.

Prayer of the Day

Father, we praise you, that through your Word and Holy Spirit you created all things; you reveal your salvation in all the world through Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh; through your Holy Spirit you give us a share in your life and love: fill us with the vision of your glory, that we may always serve and praise you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. First Reading: Proverbs 8.1-4, 8.22-31

¹ Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice? ² On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; ³ beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: ⁴ 'To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live. ²² The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. ²³ Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. ²⁴ When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. ²⁵ Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth —²⁶ when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil. ²⁷ When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, ²⁶ when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, ²⁶ when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, ³⁰ then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, ³¹ rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race.

¹ Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ² through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. ³ And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵ and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

Today's reading from Proverbs talks about Holy Wisdom. If you've ever been to Istanbul you'll have seen the former Church of the Holy Wisdom. For almost a thousand years after its construction, it was the largest cathedral in all the world. For Orthodox Christians, Holy Wisdom is Jesus Christ himself. During the Orthodox Church's Divine Liturgy a deacon will cry out 'Wisdom! Let us attend!' at points in the service to ensure that the congregation is listening to sacred teaching. And this is our sacred teaching: that our God is one God in three persons — God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. O Trinity, O Unity! Be present as we worship thee, and with the songs that angels sing unite the hymns of praise we bring. If I were to examine myself, would I find times in my life where I had focused on one member of the Holy Trinity more than another? Why or why not? Glorious, Holy and Indivisible Trinity, may all my days be spent in your praise, for you are my God: my Creator, my Redeemer, my Advocate. Give thanks for all who donate to, or otherwise support. ABM to help us spread the Gospel of love, hope and justice.




