

Fr. Alasdair writes...

Welcome to the Second Sunday after Pentecost, which is also the Festival of St. Barnabas, whom we celebrate in our service today. Although not one of the original 12 apostles, St. Luke calls him an apostle after he receives a special commission from the Holy Spirit. In a sense we are like Barnabas in the we are all called in some way to particular places within God's mission to God's world. Barnabas first preached to people who rebuffed him, but in his persistence, success finally came, and in a surprising way. If we persist in our callings, success will come, perhaps sometimes with surprising results

First Reading: Job 29.11-16

- ¹¹ When the ear heard, it commended me, and when the eye saw, it approved;
- ¹² because I delivered the poor who cried, and the orphan who had no helper.
- ¹³ The blessing of the wretched came upon me, and I caused the widow's heart to sing for joy. ¹⁴ I put on righteousness, and it clothed me; my justice was like a robe and a turban. ¹⁵ I was eyes to the blind, and feet to the lame. ¹⁶ I was a father to the needy, and I championed the cause of the stranger.

Psalm: 98

Second Reading: Acts 11.22-30; 13.1-3

11 ²² News of this came to the ears of the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. ²³ When he came and saw the grace of God, he rejoiced, and he exhorted them all to remain faithful to the Lord with steadfast devotion; ²⁴ for he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And a great many people were brought to the Lord. ²⁵ Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, ²⁶ and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. So it was that for an entire year they associated with the church and taught a great many people, and it was in Antioch that the disciples were first called 'Christians'. ²⁷ At that time prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. ²⁸ One of them named Agabus stood up and predicted by the Spirit that there would be a severe famine over all the world; and this took place during the reign of Claudius. ²⁹ The disciples determined that according to their ability, each would send relief to the believers living in Judea: ³⁰ this they did. sending it to the elders by Barnabas and Saul. 13 1 Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen a member of the court of Herod the ruler, and Saul. ² While they were worshipping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.' 3 Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off.

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

⁷ As you go, proclaim the good news, "The kingdom of heaven has come near." ⁸ Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment. ⁹ Take no gold, or silver, or copper in your belts, ¹⁰ no bag for your journey, or two tunics, or sandals, or a staff; for labourers deserve their food. ¹¹ Whatever town or village you enter, find out who in it is worthy, and stay there until you leave. ¹² As you enter the house, greet it. ¹³ If the house is worthy, let your peace come upon it; but if it is not worthy, let your peace return to you.

The name of Barnabas is associated strongly with that of the Apostle Paul. We celebrate saints because they model for us what it looks like to live lives shaped by our baptismal calling. Barnabas is named as a teacher and prophet, a good man, "full of the Holy Spirit and faith". What a testament to this man's ministry! Perhaps he was also modelling in this the other exhortation Jesus gives in today's gospel reading: to take nothing for the journey except faith, to stay where the disciples he was exhorting were welcomed, and to come and go in peace. Pray for those who are prophets and teachers in the church. Pray that God will raise up more people for these ministries. Offer prayerfully your own intention and work to be blessed by God. Give thanks for the work and witness of the Anglican Church of Melanesia, remembering especially the priests and people of St Barnabas' Provincial Cathedral, Honiara
