Preparing for Today's Eucharist

Introduction

Today we celebrate St. Francis of Assisi, who was born into wealth but chose a life of charity and simplicity. He founded the Franciscan Order, emphasizing poverty and service, and saw God's work in animals and nature, becoming the Patron Saint of Animals and the Environment. We give thanks for his life, and during this service, we bless our pets in gratitude for their love and for God's creation.

Gospel: Gospel: Trust in God's Care (Matthew 6:25–33)

In this passage, Jesus seems to be saying, "Tell me what you worry about, and I'll tell you who your master is." If you're consumed by daily concerns, they control you. Jesus makes it clear: you can serve either God or money, but not both. When guided by faith in God, everyday worries lose their grip.

Jesus also reminds us that God, the creator and sustainer of life, cares for all creation. If He provides for birds and flowers, He will certainly care for people made in His image.

Jesus refers to God as "your Father in heaven," combining the closeness of a parentchild relationship with God's perfect, all-powerful nature. God knows we need food, drink, and clothing, and while we should work to provide for ourselves and others, hunger exists because of human greed, not God's failure.

Questions for Discussion and Reflection:

- 1. Reread today's Gospel passage but imagine Jesus speaking directly to you. Does what Jesus is saying affect the way you feel? In what way? What do you need to do?
- 2. How do we know what God requires of us in practical terms? And how do we keep our priorities right?

A reading from the book of Genesis 2:24-31.

And God said, 'Let the earth bring forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind.' And it was so. God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good.

Then God said, 'Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth.'

So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them.

God blessed them, and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth.' God said, 'See, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit; you shall have them for food. And to every beast of the earth, and to every bird of the air, and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the breath of life, I have given every green plant for food.' And it was so. God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

A reading from the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew 6:25-33.

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? Therefore do not worry, saying, "What will we eat?" or "What will we drink?" or "What will we wear?" For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.


SAMARITAN'S PURSE
