Preparing for Today's Eucharist

Gospel: The Widow's Offering (Mark 12:38-44)

In this story, we see a big contrast between the important people at the Temple, who strut around in their fancy clothes, and someone who seems like the least important—the widow. She offers two tiny coins called lepta, which means "light." They're so small and cheap that most people wouldn't even bother to pick them up. But here's the thing: the real value of a gift isn't about how much it costs; it's about the love behind it. Think about a birthday gift—what really matters is the thought and care that went into it.

You can picture the widow thinking it over: could she really live without those two little coins if she gave them all to God? What would she have to give up? Just like the widow from Sidon in the first reading, her small gift is a powerful sign of her trust in God's love and care, showing she wants to do something for Him. Sure, her offering might go unnoticed among the fancy treasures of the beautiful Temple, which was famous in the eastern Mediterranean, but it's a genuine expression of her love.

The same goes for our prayers of praise—they don't really add anything to God, but they are our joyful way of sharing our love and wonder with Him.

Questions for Discussion and Reflection:

- 1. What do the actions of the widow and the religious teachers reveal about their attitude towards God? What is the role of faith, love and humility here? What can we learn from this?
- 2. What does this passage teach us about our attitude to giving and God's attitude to our gifts?
- 3. What does this passage teach us about judging by outward appearances?
- 4. How do we guard against becoming hypocrites ourselves, saying we believe something when our actions contradict our words?

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Please be seated for the reading

FIRST READING

In this reading, we meet a pagan widow who, in the middle of a famine, shares the last of her food with a hungry man. In doing so, she learns a great lesson, namely, that it is in giving that we receive.

A reading from the First Book of Kings 17:8-16.

Then the word of the Lord came to Elijah, saying, 'Go now to Zarephath, which belongs to Sidon, and live there; for I have commanded a widow there to feed you.' So he set out and went to Zarephath. When he came to the gate of the town, a widow was there gathering sticks; he called to her and said, 'Bring me a little water in a vessel, so that I may drink.' As she was going to bring it, he called to her and said, 'Bring me a morsel of bread in your hand.' But she said, 'As the Lord your God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful of meal in a jar, and a little oil in a jug; I am now gathering a couple of sticks, so that I may go home and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it, and die.' Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid; go and do as you have said; but first make me a little cake of it and bring it to me, and afterwards make something for yourself and your son. For thus says the Lord the God of Israel: The jar of meal will not be emptied and the jug of oil will not fail until the day that the Lord sends rain on the earth.' She went and did as Elijah said, so that she as well as he and her household ate for many days. The jar of meal was not emptied, neither did the jug of oil fail, according to the word of the Lord that he spoke by Elijah.

Hear the word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

SECOND READING

Through his death, Christ has taken our sins upon himself and he has opened for us the door of salvation.

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews 9:24-28

For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgement, so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

Hear the word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

They devour widows' houses and for the sake of appearance say long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation.'

He sat down opposite the treasury, and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny. Then he called his disciples and said to them, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

SERMON

THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Please stand as we affirm our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed, each in our preferred language.

We believe in one God, the Father, the almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the Forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

please kneel/sit

Let us pray that we may learn the lesson of today's Gospel - that it is not the size of our offering that matters in God's eyes, but the cost of it and the spirit in which we give it.

(At the end of each section) Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Tomorrow is Remembrance Day, we pray for the defence and police forces:

Eternal God, the only source of peace, we pray for all who serve in the defence and police forces of this land. Give them courage and comfort in danger, patience in waiting, and discipline in the just use of force. Help us to seek for all people the freedom to serve you and each other in compassion and peace. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Conclude the prayer with:

Almighty God, you have promised to hear our prayers:

Grant that what we have asked in faith, we may by your grace receive, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

PRAYER OF APPROACH

[Let us pray.]

We do not presume to come to your table, merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in your manifold and great mercies.

We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your table.

But you are the same Lord whose nature is always to have mercy.

Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

Invitation to Confession

With regard to gifts we have a saying that goes: 'It's the thought that counts'. Yet in practice we often forget this and use a different criterion. We judge a gift by its size, that is, by its cost. But this can be so unfair. Christ did not fall for it. He said that the poor widow who gave exactly one penny gave more than anyone else. We often judge our own contribution and that of others by standards other than those of the Gospel. (Pause).

God is generous with his forgiveness. Let us ask pardon for all the unfair and false judgements we make.

Merciful God, our maker and our judge,

we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed,

and in what we have failed to do:

we have not loved you with our whole heart;

we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves;

we repent, and are sorry for all our sins.

Father, forgive us.

Strengthen us to love and obey you in newness of life;

through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE ABSOLUTION

Almighty God, who has promised forgiveness to all who turn to him in faith: pardon you and set you free from all your sins, strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THE PEACE

We are the body of Christ. His Spirit is with us.

The peace of the Lord be always with you. And also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Renew us by your Holy Spirit, unite us in the body of your Son, and bring us with all your people into the joy of your eternal kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, we worship you, Father, in songs of never-ending praise:

Blessing and honour and glory and power are yours for ever and ever. Amen.
